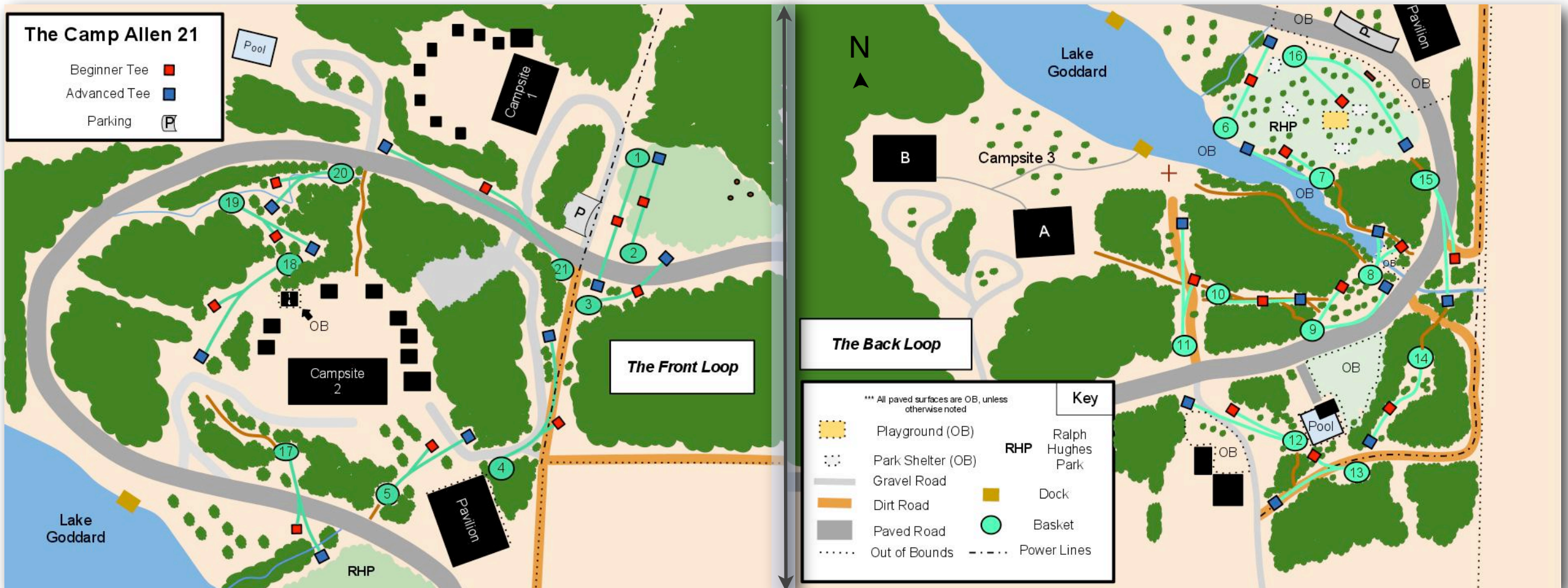

What is Disc Golf?

Disc golf is a lot like traditional "ball" golf, except players throw plastic flying discs at an above ground basket. The player begins by "driving" from a designated tee area and continues toward the basket, throwing each consecutive shot from the spot where the previous throw has landed. The object of the game is to land your disc into the metal basket in the fewest throws possible.

Disc Rental

Discs are available at the front desk. Disc rentals require leaving your driver's license at the front desk until the discs are returned. Guests will be charged \$6 for each unreturned disc.

Disc Golf Rules for Recreational Play

Tee Throws

Tee throws must be completed within or behind the designated tee area. Do not throw until the players in front of you are out of range.

Lie

The spot where the previous throw has landed, mark with a mini disc or turn over the thrown disc, directly towards the hole.

Throwing Order

After teeing off, the player whose disc is farthest from the hole always throws first. The player with the least amount of throws on the previous hole is the first to tee off on the next hole.

Fairway Throws

Fairway throws must be made with the foot closest to the hole on the lie. The other foot may be no closer to the hole than the lie. A run-up and normal follow-through, after release, is allowed.

Completion of Hole

A disc that comes to rest in the basket or chains constitutes successful completion of that hole.

Un-Playable Lie

Any disc that comes to rest above the ground is considered an un-playable lie. The disc must be thrown from the lie on the ground, directly underneath the un-playable lie.

Out of Bounds (OB)

A disc that lands completely out of bounds must be played from a point 3 feet in bounds from where the disc went out of bounds, permanent water hazards and public roads are OB.

Local Course Rules

Drop Zones

If advanced players (Blue) throw their first shot OB, then the beginner (Red) tee is the drop zone. Shots other than drives that land OB will be played from a point 3 feet in bounds from where the disc went out of bounds. Beginner players may take a penalty stroke for an OB throw from the tee, but can play from the point where the disc went out of bounds. Throws in the lake or on paved surfaces are OB.

Course Courtesy

Please pick up trash and help new players play by the rules. Keep in mind that many people gather here to experience the beauty of this place. Please do not disturb other guests by entering campsites or areas that are not rented by your group. Yell "FORE!" to alert a group if you have an errant throw that is flying towards them.

Never intentionally throw a disc in the direction of another person or player.

If a person is in the fairway, please warn them that you will be throwing in their direction. Once they have moved you are free to throw. If they do not move, skip ahead to the next hole.

Hole Information

The paved road is always OB except on holes 15 and 21. Throws in the lake are OB.

Hole 4: Have a spotter clear the gravel road before you throw.

Hole 5: Water is seasonal and is casual (not OB).

Hole 8: Creek bed and water are OB. Make it to the opposite bank to be in play.

Hole 9: Paved road and grass field on left side of road are OB.

Hole 15: Paved road is casual (not OB).

Hole 16: Wooden posts along the right side of the fairway mark OB. Park shelters and playground are also OB.

Hole 18: A throw under cabin 14 is OB.

Holes 19 and 20: Water is casual.

Hole 21: Road is casual.
